Birth - Death: ? - 1810

Research Note: John Bechtold: born about: 1740 Lancaster Co., Pa (Muddy Creek Church records microfilm FHL# 0020346 starts in 1743)

## Charles John Marten Essex

Birth - Death: 28 Jul 1863 - 10 Jun 1927

Research Note: English County Boundary Changes: there have been numerous changes to county boundaries over the years causing confusion for genealogists. Counties surrounding London, absorbed into London: Hertfordshire, Middlesex, Buckinghamshire, Berkshire, Surrey, Kent and large pieces of Essex (overlap with East Anglia) Sussex is also sometimes included.

Each county is divided into parishes. Registers of all baptisms, marriages and burials in each parish church have been kept since 1538. As towns grew, many of the old town parishes were sub-divided into new parishes. Diocese of London included a wide geographical area: not only the square mile of the City, but parts of the ancient counties of Essex and Middlesex, and some parishes in Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire.

## Jacob Frey

Birth - Death: Bet. 1766–1774 - ?

Research Note: Researching Jacob Frey and Rebecca. Church records show they are the parents of Elizabeth Frey (married Solomon Vonnieda.) Jacob Frey of Lancaster Co., PA, Muddy Creek Reformed Church (E Cocalico Township.)

Baptism Sponsors for Elizabeth Frey are George & Elizabeth Roedel. This Elizabeth Roedel is Elizabeth Frey according to the 1806 will of her father, Martin Fry, and the 1818 will of her mother, Elizabeth. I have little doubt that Jacob Frey fits into this family somewhere and suspect that Elizabeth Roedel is either Elizabeth's Aunt or Great Aunt.

Records show a son, Moses Frey b. 1817. I've tracked a Moses Frey and his family in census' to Bule Mounds, Dane Co., WI, Mitchell Co., IA, Columbia Co., WA and Portland OR. In 1900 Moses Fry is living with his daughter Ida Almeda Erbe, w/o Jacob Erbe, in Cedar, Mitchell Co., Iowa.

There are several Jacob Frys in the Lancaster area in the 1800's, some families scattered, and I have not been able to track for sure the "Jacob Fry" father of Elizabeth Fry (b.1815). There are two or three possible "Jacob Frey" for Elizabeth and Moses.

Census records for Lancaster County show Jacob Fry (Brecknock Twp) with one female child in the 1790 household. In 1800 (Cocalico Twp.) there were 2 males under 10, Jacob age 26/44, 1 female under 10 and 1 female 26/44. In 1810 (Cocalico) there were 4 males under 10, 1 male 10 thru 15, Jacob age 26/44, 3 females under 10, 2 females 10 thru 15, 1 female 26/44. In 1820 (Cocalico) 2 males under 10, 1 male 10 thru 15, 1 male 16 thru 25, 1 male 45+, 1 female under 10, 2 females 10 thru 15, 2 females 16 thru 25, no females listed in the 45+ range.

Other family surnames in the Lancaster County area are Heft, Heberling and Bechtold. It appears that our Rider and Erhart families were in Lancaster County and possibly in the same Muddy Creek church records.

## John T. Hardesty

Birth - Death: Bet. Nov–Dec 1840 - 18 Mar 1893

Research Note: Possible parents of John T. Hardesty are William Hardesty and Elizabeth as shown in the census information below. There is a George W. listed in the 1889/1890 Dayton, Ohio Directory at the same address with John T. Hardesty and family members. Based on the 1860 Maryland Census George could be John's brother. [working with Stan Hardesty who is a descendant of William E., son of William Hardesty and Elizabeth. Stan thinks Elizabeth is Elizabeth Lyles.]

1840 Maryland, Anne Arundel Co., 1st district: William age 20 to 30, female 20 to 30, no children; John T. isn't born until Oct or Dec 1840. The ages are constant with the William and Elizabeth in the 1850 & 1860 census of the same county.

1850 Maryland, Anne Arundel Co., 1st district: William 39, Wheelwright, Elisabeth 27 (probably should be 37 since she is listed as 46 in the next census ten years later, John T. 9, Ann 8, William E. 4, Mary M. 1

1860 Maryland, Anne Arundel Co., dis 8: Wm 49, Elizabeth 46, Ann age not readable, William 15, Mary 13, Josephine 11, George 6, James 2. There is a John Hardesty living in the next house with the family of **George Wood and Caroline**. John is listed as 19.

1870 Maryland, Baltimore Co., John and his wife & children appear in the 1870 census next to the same **George & Caroline Wood** family as in the 1860 listing above, but in Baltimore Co. [county boundaries may have changed] In the 1870 census, Josephine, age 23, is listed as a Wood, but not in age order with the other Wood children, which leads me to believe that she is probably Josephine Hardesty.

Churches the family attended: The family resided in the border area between Anne Arundel Co and Calvert Co. Churches attended are: Mt. Zion Methodist Church in Lothian, MD; Friendship Methodist Church; Mt. Harmony Methodist in Tracey's Landing, MD; St James Episcopal Church in Owings, MD; Christ Church in Owens, MD.

## JAMES & GEORGE W. HARDESTY

Siblings of John T. Hardesty possibly found in 1900 Census. 1900 MD, Calvert Co., Dis 3, pg 94A; James & Geo W. Hardesty living next to each other. James b. Aug 1860, wife Martha b. Sept 1863, children Isabelle, age 6, b. Jun 1894, Lottie Edna age 7mths, b. Oct 1899. Next house, Geo W. b. Jun/Jan 1854, wife Agnes b. Oct 1873, dau. G??? age 14.

## LOTTIE EDNA HARDESTY NORFOLK

Possible dau of James (above). 1920 Census, Anne Arundel County, MD, Lottie Edna Norfolk age 21, husband Leslie Norfolk. Obit. Norfolk, Edna Lottie. On Nov 7, 1985; mother of Vivian O. Ballard, Marjorie E. Daniels, Edna J. Lauck, Barbara N. McCully, and Peggy A. Brown. Lee Funeral Home of Clinton, 6633 Old Alexander Ferry Rd., Clinton, MD. Interment Fort Lincoln Cemetery.

## JOSEPHINE HARDESTY

Possible sibling of John T. Hardesty. 1920 Anne Arundel County, MD, Josephine Hardesty Phipps m. 21 Jan 1874 to Joseph E. Phipps, children Ruth age 24, John H. age 18, gr dau Thelma F. age 4.

## Rudolph Heberling

Birth - Death: 27 Sep 1728 - 10 Apr 1812

He was twice married; first wife (name unknown) was mother of John, Rudy, Catherine & Elizabeth. No children by second marriage (around 1792) to Mary Magdalena Helt. Per G. Wayne Heberlig, his parents were Hans & Barbara Gallmann Haberlig of Ottenbach, Canton Zurich, Switzerland. He was baptized at the Reformed Ch of Ottenbach. He arrived at Philadelphia on 27 Sep 1749 aboard the "Isaac" and settled near Gouglersville, Berks Co.

## Mary Warwick

Birth - Death: Abt. 1815 - ?

Research Note: Possible parents of Mary Warwick  
New Jersey Marriages, 1684-1895  
Richard WARRICK and Mary CHEESEMAN, 17 May 1812 Gloucester NJ

The Cheeseman's are originally from Gloucester County, New Jersey. Richard C. Warwick owned land in Indiana and Texas; possibly Ohio also. The land in Texas was in the same county where Mary Warwick and her 2nd husband David Vance lived in 1850 & 1860. Texas land abstracts show the land was left to the heirs of Richard Warwick, but does not list the names of the heirs.

According to the publication, "Portrait and Biographical Record, Montgomery, Parke and Fountain Counties Indiana", it is noted that Joshua Freeman, of Randolph County, "was there married to Mary Warrick, a daughter of a pioneer farmer of that section."

Copy of letter from Charlie Morris to Helen Fackson dated Apr 20, 1999. Charlie states that Mary Warwick, wife of Joshua Freeman, was the dau of Richard Cheeseman Warwick and Mary Cheesman. A Richard Warwick married Mary Cheesman in Gloucester Co on May 17, 1812. They came from Gloucester Co, NJ into the area of Ross Co., OH. The father of Richard was probably William Warrick (Warwick). The father of Mary Cheesman could have been Edmond Cheesman, though Edmond could have been a brother since the 1810 Ross County census shows him as 26-45 years old. Both William Warrick and Edmond Cheesman were in the 1820 census of Ross Co, OH. A Richard Warwick in 1830 is in Fayette Co., OH. It appears that when Mary Warwick Freeman ran off with David Vance, her parents went with them, as they sold their property in Wayne County in 1841. William Warwick, Jr. sold his property in Randolph County in 1847 and was living in Catahoula Parish, LA at that time.

The parents of Richard Warwick appear to be William Warwick and Jemima Cheesman who married Jan 25, 1780 in Gloucester Co., NJ. Richard C and his wife Mary named a dau Jemima, who married Isaac Comer in 1834. They had a dau, Beulah Ann who married Mark Davis in 1833 and died in Howard Co., IN.

A Jemima Cheesman has a will in Gloucester Co., NJ in 1798. This could be the mother of Jemima that married William Warwick. There are wills in that same NJ county for five Richard Cheesman's dated 1789, 1796, 1800, 1801 and 1812.

### Richard Cheesman Warwick

Research Note: Land Records show that Richard Cheesman Warwick purchased land in Randolph County in 1832, 33, 34 and 36; (R15 T19 S4 & R15 T19 S8). Nathan Freeman, father of Joshua, owned land next to Richard Warwick; (R15 T19 S6)

1830 Census, Fayette Co., OH - Richard Warwick, 2 boys under 5, 1 male 5 to 10, 2 males 20 to 30, 1 male 30 to 40, 2 females 10 to 15, 1 female 15 to 20, 1 female 30 to 40.

1840 Census, Wayne Co., IN - Richard Warwick, 1 male 20 to 30, 1 male 50 to 60, 2 females under 5, 1 female 30 to 40.
